<b>Date poll was conducted</b>	Interviews were conducted over the period 1 <sup>st</sup> to 6 <sup>th</sup> September 2005
<b>Sample Size</b>	997 voter eligible New Zealanders aged 18+
<b>Sampling Technique</b>	Telephone Interviews. Random generation of telephone numbers with quota sampling to ensure representative cross section by age, sex and geography.
<b>Sample Coverage</b>	National including rural, secondary urban and main urban areas
<b>Sample Error</b>	Maximum of 3.1% expressed at a 95% confidence level
