Department also contracts with community organisations to provide the programmes designed to address the underlying causes of re-offending for community sentences and orders:

- treatment programmes
- violence prevention programmes
- drug programmes
- cognitive behavioural programmes
- Residential Centres.

• treatment programmes provide treatment for adult sex offenders who are children and adolescents.

• violence prevention programmes teach offenders the skills needed to live in the community such as controlling violence impulses and conflict resolution. The Department refers offenders to external programme providers who are accredited under the Domestic Violence Act 1995.

Alcohol and drug programmes can be provided in residential and non-residential settings in the community. Residential alcohol and drug treatment programmes are provided by a number of external providers, and focus on offenders with a history of
