Process for Expressions of Interest: Convention and Exhibition Centre

Purpose of Report

This report provides you with an outline of next steps following receipt of the responses to the Expressions of Interest request (copy attached), which are due on 18 June 2010.

Part A - Views from the sector

- Part A of the EOI seeks views from the sector on what needs to be done to increase the number of business events in New Zealand and how the national network of convention venues could be strengthened. The information gathered from Part A will inform the development of advice to you on a National Business Events Strategy.
- Information received from Part A will be summarised and reported to you by 29 June 2010.

Part B – Establishment of an International-standard National Convention and Exhibition Centre

- 4 Respondents to Part B of the EOI will be proposing sites on which an international-standard national convention and exhibition centre could be developed. A two-stage process will be used for assessing these proposals.
- First officials will review each proposal against a set of criteria as shown in Appendix 1. We will report to you how each one rates against these criteria and identify the top 3-4 proposals by 29 June 2010.
- The second stage will involve taking the top 3-4 proposals and having these reviewed by a panel of experts. Three New Zealand-based and three internationally based individuals will form the panel (see Appendix 2 for details). We believe they have the right mix of knowledge, skills and expertise required to assist us in identifying which proposals might warrant more detailed scrutiny by government.

- The panel will review proposals individually and then meet via video conference to discuss them jointly. We will provide you with an update following their feedback.
- It is estimated that the assessment process will involve approximately two days work in total for each of the panel. The fees for the international assessors are estimated at \$3000 \$5000 each members and there will be a fee of \$2,800 for one New Zealand based assessor.

Part C - Expansion of existing convention and exhibition centre(s)

9 MED officials will assess the responses received in relation to Part C of the EOI and report these to you with recommendations on next steps by 29 June 2010.

Background

The "Request for Expression of Interest for Growing New Zealand's share of the International Business Events Market and Strengthening the National Network of Convention Venues" was published on the Government Electronic Tender System (GETS) on 19 May 2010. The Request was advertised in 9 major newspapers in the week of 22 May 2010. MED sent copies of the Request to all the organisations that were invited to your convention sector discussions in Auckland, Wellington and Christchurch. To date 184 copies of the Request have been downloaded from the GETS website.
