61 ANGELA'S ASHES

Frank McCourt

Frank McCourt's poverty stricken childhood in Ireland comes to life in a memoir that is as comic as it is tragic.

62 MAO'S LAST DANCER

Li Cunxin

The true story of a poor Chinese peasant boy, who spent seven gruelling years at the Peking Ballet Academy. Performing in the US led to his dramatic defection.

63 THE MEMORY KEEPER'S DAUGHTER

Kim Edwards

What happens when a choice is made to protect the ones you love – but it affects their lives, and can haunt you for decades?

64 DUNE

Frank Herbert

This tells the sweeping tale of a desert planet called Arrakis, the focus of an intricate power struggle in a byzantine interstellar empire. It's one of the most famous science fiction novels ever written.

65 JESSICA

Bryce Courtenay

The story of a young woman growing up in the harsh environment of the Australian outback in the 1940's. It's an epic story about her search for justice against seemingly impossible odds.

George Orwell

The original futuristic look at what our lives would become – it was prescient. A true modern classic.

Stephen King

This is an apocalyptic vision of a world blasted by plague and embroiled in an elemental struggle between good and evil.

Lee Child

This recent book predates Lee Child's first thriller, *The Killing Floor.* Everything starts somewhere, and for elite military cop Jack Reacher, that somewhere was Carter Crossing, Mississippi, back in 1997.

70 THE BIBLE

The Bible has appeared on every single Top 100 List since we started taking votes. It continues to inspire and guide, and is as relevant now as it ever was.

71 TULLY

Paullina Simons

Tully is a tough young woman from the wrong side of the tracks who forms an enduring bond with two school friends. But their lives are changed forever by two young men, and a tragedy engulfs them all. Her first book and, many believe, her best.

72 THE SECRET

Rhonda Byrne

The secret of obtaining anything you desire is now revealed by prominent physicists, authors and philosophers as being based on the universal Law of Attraction. Anyone can access its power to bring themselves health, wealth and happiness

73 THE GIRL IN TIMES SQUARE

Paullina Simons

From one of our most popular authors comes this magnificent novel. It's the odyssey of two young women, Lily and Amy, roommates and friends on the verge of the rest of their lives.

74 THE PACT

Jodi Picoult

Popular high school swimming star Chris Harte and talented artist Em Gold bonded as infants; their parents have been best friends for 18 years. When they fall in love, everyone is ecstatic – except for Em.

75 61 HOURS

Lee Child

A bus skids and crashes in a gathering storm. On the back seat, Jack Reacher, hitching a ride to nowhere. A life without baggage has many advantages – and disadvantages too, like facing the Arctic cold without a coat.

76 APRIL FOOLS DAY

Bryce Courtenay

Bryce Courtenay's son Damon died on April Fool's Day. In this tribute to his son he writes of suffering, struggle, compassion, and about understanding: how when we confront our worst, we can become our best.

77 I KNOW THIS MUCH IS TRUE

Wally Lamb

This is an epic story of identical twins: a paranoid schizophrenic and his brother whose life is dominated by his resentment of and love for his damaged twin. He has beaten the biochemical odds to remain sane – but at what cost?

78 KANE & ABEL

Jeffrey Archer

Many readers think this is Archer's best book – about two men, born on the same day in different parts of the world who, when their paths eventually cross are thrown into a world of double dealings, backstabbing and intrigue.

79 CHOCOLAT

Joanne Harris

The battle lines between Church and chocolate are drawn in this wonderful story about a bewitching confectioner who settles in a sleepy French village and arouses the appetites of the pleasure starved parishioners.

80 THE NO. 1 LADIES' DETECTIVE AGENCY

Alexander McCall Smith

Precious Ramotswe inherits her father's cattle herd and sells it to start a new life. She opens the first private detective agency run by a woman in Botswana, and then sits back and waits for clients. Gentle, charming, funny and the first in a very welcome series.

81 HOUSE RULES

Jacob Hunt is a teenager with Aspergers – wanting to be like everyone else but not knowing how. When his tutor is found dead, all the hallmark behaviours of Aspergers start to look a lot like guilt to the police. And Jacob's mother must ask herself the hardest question in the world: is her child capable of murder?

82 MISTER PIP

Lloyd Jones

With references to *Great Expectations*, this is an innovative story about what happens when soldiers invade a tropical island - by one of our finest writers.

83 NINETEEN MINUTES

Jodi Picoult

Sterling is a small, ordinary New Hampshire town where nothing ever happens – until a student enters the local high school with an arsenal of guns and starts shooting, changing the lives of everyone both inside and out.

84 CAPTAIN CORELLI'S MANDOLIN

Louis De Bernieres

Captain Corelli's Mandolin is set in the early days of WW2, before Benito Mussolini invaded Greece. It's about love, politics, history and war on the island of Cephalonia.

85 FALL OF GIANTS Ken Follet

A huge, wonderful historical novel which follows 5 families through World War 1, the Russian Revolution, and the struggle for women's suffrage.

86 PERSUASION

Jane Austen

Set in the fashionable societies of Lyme Regis and Bath, Jane Austen's last completed novel is a brilliant satire of vanity and pretension - but, above all, it is a love story tinged with the heartache of missed opportunities.

87 WILD SWANS

Jung Chang

The true story of the lives of 3 generations of women in one Chinese family, from 1909 to 1991. An extraordinary book.

88 ATONEMENT

Ian McEwan

By the end of one long hot summer's day, the lives of three young people will have changed forever – one of whom will commit a crime, for which she will spend the rest of her life trying to atone. Magnificent.

89 THE CATCHER IN THE RYE

J D Salinger

Wry observations from a teenager just expelled from school, this is still edgy, insightful and essential reading, despite having been written in 1951.

90 THE LUCKY ONE

Nicholas Sparks

The story of a US Marine, Logan Thibault, who finds a photograph of a smiling young woman in Iraq. During his three tours of duty, he carries it with him as a good luck charm and on his return, goes looking for the woman in the photo to thank her.

91 THE POTATO FACTORY

Bryce Courtenay

The first in a trilogy, this is the story of a harsh journey from 19th Century London, to the convict settlement of Van Diemen's Land, and the family ambitions and enmities which bring the protagonists to the edge of disaster.

92 SCAR TISSUE

Anthony Kiedis

The rock and roller's life of success and excess is here transcended by the story itself - a truly memorable insight into a life like no other. If you enjoy great biography, this is one you shouldn't miss.

93 THE WINTER ROSE

Jennifer Donnelly

Set in London and Africa in the early days of the Twentieth Century, this book continues the story started in *The Tea Rose,* # 21 on this List.

94 CALL THE MIDWIFE *Jennifer Worth*

A true story of life in London's East End in the 1950's – a world which has now changed beyond recognition. It was made into a much loved TV series.

95 THE SNOWMAN

Jo Nesbo

A Harry Hole thriller from the master of the Scandinavian Crime genre. Great if you love Stieg Larsson – but has also been compared to *The Silence of the Lambs.*

96 THE PROMISE

Lesley Pearse

The riveting sequel to *Belle*, #51 on this List.

97 WORLD WITHOUT END Ken Follett

The sequel to *The Pillars Of The Earth.* It is now some 200 years later and the town of Kingsbridge is still dominated by its magnificent cathedral. But times have changed - war and plague have dramatically affected the infrastructure of the Middle Ages.

98 ONE FOR THE MONEY

Janet Evanovich

The first title in the wonderful, feisty, witty, and much adored Stephanie Plum series.

Erin Morgenstern

100 IT


Stephen King
