North American screen industry investment in New Zealand

- North America contributes between 80 and 90 per cent of all international screen revenue in New Zealand. Last year it represented an investment in the New Zealand economy of \$387 million – a rise of 30 per cent on the previous year
- An increasing proportion is in contract work, where specialised production or postproduction services are contracted by a North American business. In just three years the income from North America received by NZ screen contractors has increased almost fivefold, going from \$23 million to \$106 million

The New Zealand situation

- New Zealand's film and television industry has risen to become one of our most lucrative
 \$2.99 billion in 2011
- It supports over 2700 businesses, over 95 per cent of which were involved in production and post-production work
- Production and post-production work is the creative part of the screen industry; in which films, television programmes and commercials are made. This sector has continued to grow despite challenging economic times, and was worth \$1403 million in 2011
- The film sector alone contributes half of all production and post-production revenue. In 2011 this was worth \$700 million
- More than 1000 New Zealand businesses contracted services to the feature film industry in 2011

Who is filming here?

The US studios have been filming in New Zealand for two decades starting with Ron Howard's *Willow* (Imagine Films Entertainment/MGM) in 1988. In feature films, these early beginnings were followed by the landmark *Lord of the Rings Trilogy* (New Line Cinema), *Vertical Limit* (Sony Pictures), *The Last Samurai* (Warner Bros. Entertainment), *The Chronicles of Narnia: The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe* (Walden Media and Walt Disney Pictures), *King Kong* (Universal Pictures), *The Lovely Bones* (Dreamworks *SKG*) through to more recent projects such as *The Adventures of Tintin:The Secret of the Unicorn* (Paramount Pictures), *Yogi Bear* (Warner Bros. Entertainment), *Avatar* (Twentieth Century Fox), and currently *The Hobbit Trilogy* (Warner Bros. Entertainment). New Zealand also has major US clients in television production, including *Spartacus* (Starz Media), *Penguins of Madagascar* (Nickelodeon), *Legend of the Seeker* (The Walt Disney Company), and *Power Rangers* (The Walt Disney Company then Saban Entertainment), as well as global broadcast networks National Geographic and Discovery Channels.
