


IoD Directors' Fees Report 2013


The Institute of Directors (IoD) in conjunction with dsd Consulting has released their 2013 IoD Directors' Fees Report. The report is a key source of information on director remuneration trends in the New Zealand market. This infographic is a snapshot of the results of the survey. Directors and Chairmen



The median fee for a non-executive director remained static at \$36,000 while the median fee for a non-executive chairman increased 2.4% to \$50.000.






For both non-executive chairmen and directors there is a clear correlation between the value of shareholder funds of the organisation and remuneration, as shown in the graph on the left.

Women on Boards



Overall, female directors represented 19.9% of the total sample, a solid increase from last year when women made up 17.3% of the sample. Looking at non-executive roles on the board 13% of chairmen and 23% of directors were women.





The variance in the median fee for non-executive directors by gender (as shown in the graph on the left) is a reflection of the types of boards women serve on. 42% of individuals serving on not-for-profit boards in the survey were women.


Survey Sample

Respondents that were satisfied with their remuneration


Highest non-executive director median fee \$90k (>\$1billion shareholder funds)

New Zealand vs Overseas Owned





A non-executive director of an overseas owned company has a median fee of almost 50% more than that of a New Zealand owned company.
