

New Zealand's teen birth rates are high internationally










Teen births are down




More teenagers are delaying sex

(Youth 2012 survey)




Contraception use has not improved over the last ten years

The percentage of sexually active students who always use contraception (to prevent pregnancy) has remained unchanged at about

across the three surveys

(of the 328 teen births in the Growing up in New Zealand Study, 2010)

Teen mothers are older

17 and under 28.4%

Births to younger teens have fallen the most, with almost three quarters of teen mothers aged 18 - 19 when they give birth (up from two-thirds in 2006)
