John Psathas: *Luminous* Prokofiev: *Violin Concerto No. 2* Sibelius: *Symphony No. 2*  Prokofiev's concerto contains his trade-mark sunlit melodies, harmonic shifts, and angular writing. Sibelius' symphony is one of his best-loved works. Its turmoil and triumph are thought to depict Finland's struggle for independence.

Russian violinist Ilya Gringolts, a 2017 Michael Hill International Violin Competition jury member, is internationally renowned for his extremely virtuosic playing and sensitive interpretations. Conducting will be Marc Taddei.


# SOLOIST Li-Wei Qin

China-born Li-Wei Qin studied in both Australia and the UK, and now teaches in Singapore. Since his 2004 DSO performance, he has continued to perform with the world's most prestigious orchestras and musicians.

As a Czech musician in a Germano-centric world, Dvorák career only took off after Brahms's active encouragement, and it included time in the USA when he composed this Cello Concerto.



Marking USA composer John Adams's 70th birthday, the concert opens with his 'orchestral foxtrot' from his opera *Nixon in China*, depicting "a youthful Mao Tse-Tung dancing the foxtrot with his mistress Chiang Ch'ing".

# Rimsky-Korsakov's Scheherazade & Brahms's Requiem

## **SIMON OVER**

## Programme:

Rimsky-Korsakov: *Scheherazade* (Violin soloist: Tessa Petersen) Brahms: *A German Requiem*  Rimsky-Korsakov introduced *Scheherazade* as follows: "The Sultan had sworn to put to death each of his wives. But the Sultana Scheherazade saved her life by telling him tales for one thousand and one nights ... until he at last gave up entirely on his bloody plan."

The *Requiem* is one of Brahms's most popular works. Although Brahms was a believer, he was not overtly religious, and later said that he would have preferred the word "Human" rather than "German" in this work's title.

Rebecca Ryan studied in New Zealand and the UK and has sung with leading orchestras and opera companies in both countries. Jarvis Dams was a 2016 Lexus SongQuest semi-finalist and was also selected for the Dame Kiri te Kanawa Foundation programme.

## Programme:

JS Bach: Concerto for Violin and Oboe Respighi: The Birds JS Bach: Concerto for Oboe D'Amore Mozart: Symphony No. 41, Jupiter JS Bach's music incorporates musical inventiveness, drama, and exquisite beauty – all of which are evident in this concert's two concerti. The soloist is Robert Orr, NZSO's Principal Oboeist.

Tasmanian-based conductor Daniel Kossov was born in Russia, emigrated to Israel, and graduated from the Curtis Institute and London's Guildhall School. At the age of 23, he became Australia's youngest ever concertmaster in Perth. His currently conducts in Australia, Israel, Russia and Europe. Appropriately, he will be directing the Bach double concerto from the violin.

In Respighi's *The Birds*, this 20th century composer freely re-works four Baroque keyboard pieces while depicting characteristics of four different birds.

Rounding off the concert is Mozart's *Jupiter Symphony*, which finishes with one of the most extraordinary symphonic movements ever written. Mozart presents and then interweaves no less than five musical themes.

## Programme:

Stravinsky: Pulcinella Suite Vivaldi: Flute Concerto, 'La Notte' Puccini: The Chrysanthemums Briccialdi: Flute Concerto Mendelssohn: Symphony No. 4, 'Italian' Melbourne-based conductor Richard Davis and soloist DSO Principal Flute Luca Manghi will guide us through an Italian-themed concert.

Vivaldi's Baroque *La Notte* ("The Night") is far from docile - its second movement is entitled "Fantasmi" - "Ghosts".

From the 19th century are Briccialdi's flute concerto, Puccini's *The Chrysanthemums* - an elegy for an Italian-born nobleman who had briefly served as the King of Spain in the 1870s, and Mendelssohn's *Italian Symphony* - written after an 1830 Italian trip, conveying Italy's countryside, art and architecture.

More recently is Stravinsky's *Pulcinella Suite* (1922), drawn from his music for a full ballet. This is based on Pergolesi's music, spiced with Stravinsky's characteristic pungent harmonies and taut rhythms.
