## **BACKGROUND**

Immigration New Zealand (INZ) administers the flow of migrants to New Zealand. There are a number of different reasons that migrants come to New Zealand and different rules apply to each group of people. As such Immigration New Zealand administers migrants under a number of Categories to reflect these different rules.

One of the categories under which migrants can move to New Zealand is by way of a temporary work visa. This is a visa issued for a person to come to New Zealand and fill a role where it has been impossible to find suitable New Zealand nationals to meet staffing requirements. These visas are issued for a fixed period of time, after which the migrant is required to either apply for a new visa, or leave the country.

To ensure that potential migrants are suitably skilled, experienced and of good character and health, Immigration New Zealand requires applicants to complete and submit standard documentation designed to gather necessary information.

In addition, Immigration New Zealand requires proof that there are no suitable New Zealand based applicants for the position and that genuine attempts have been made to recruit on shore.

Further to this Immigration New Zealand require evidence that the employer has offered the position as claimed, the conditions of employment meet certain criteria and minimum wages and their business is genuine and sustainable.

Having assessed the submitted evidence, Immigration Officers may then perform further verification checks with interested parties, such as employers or applicants, to ensure the information provided is accurate or to gather further detail where appropriate.

Once a visa is issued on the information provided, the applicant may then travel to New Zealand to fill the employment position offered.

Once in New Zealand it is expected that the migrant will occupy the role they have applied for until the end of their contract or the end of their visa.

However, they may vary their visa conditions in some circumstances, while maintaining the general conditions and circumstances under which they were granted a visa, or if necessary, they may subsequently apply for a new visa while they are still in New Zealand, for example to work for another company.

## **BACKGROUND PHILIPPINES**

With a high population and low average income, many Filipinos seek employment opportunities overseas, often leaving partners and young children at home while living abroad where they can earn a better income.

Often these workers will endure poor living conditions to maximise the amount of money they can send back to their families.

Expenses for medical treatment or education can leave families desperate for a higher income, with few opportunities in the Philippines. As a result many Filipinos will go to great

lengths and take risks, often incurring significant debts, for the opportunity to work offshore and improve their income and prospects.

A normal rate of interest on debts incurred by such migrants is 5% per month. As a result of this, their debts grow quickly if they are unable to find an income, pushing them to even more desperate measures.

## **DEFENDANT'S BUSINESS MODEL**

The defendant, Loraine Anne JAYME, also known by her maiden name of Loraine Anne CANDOR, was born in the Philippines and moved to New Zealand in 2006, initially working with her husband Vincent in the dairy industry.

The defendant eventually moved to Te Aroha and began operating as a self-styled employment consultant. Part of her business involved recruiting Filipino's to fill roles in the New Zealand dairy industry.

Her business adopted a reasonably uniform process whereby she would respond to dairy industry advertisements for staff, usually advertised through the Fonterra 'Fencepost' (and latterly 'Farmsource') website, offering employers the opportunity to take on Filipino dairy workers.

The defendant then assisted the farmer with the Immigration paperwork required in bringing staff to New Zealand.

Meanwhile, the defendant's profile in the Philippines grew until she was able to sustain her flow of applicants by word of mouth.

Again her business model was reasonably uniform, in that applicants make contact with the defendant usually by email and are furnished with a standard response outlining requirements and fees.

The defendant currently requires a payment of 76,000 pesos (approx. NZ\$2,250) from applicants, payable to her bank account in the Philippines. The applicants need to meet all other expenses themselves.

Having paid the fee, the applicant then goes into a queuing system, sometimes for many months, awaiting a job offer through the defendant.

The defendant eventually emails the applicant instructing them to complete a medical examination, as required by Immigration New Zealand, and supplying them with the appropriate Immigration New Zealand forms.

Having completed the medical assessment, the applicant contacts the defendant and awaits confirmation that they have a job offer with a New Zealand company.

The defendant eventually emails them with explicit instructions on completing their application, often accompanied by a blank Immigration New Zealand work visa application form and additional paperwork attached to be included with their application.

The paperwork typically attached is confirmation of a Fencepost (or Farmsource) advertisement, a letter (or other confirmation) from Work and Income New Zealand

confirming there are no suitable local applicants for the job, an Employment Agreement (or Employment Contract) from the employer and an Immigration New Zealand 'Employer Supplementary Form' as completed by the employer and outlining company specific details.

In some instances there is also a letter from the employer confirming the offer of employment.

Following the defendant's directions, the applicant completes the application form and submits all the paperwork as instructed to Immigration New Zealand's office in Manila, Philippines, along with the appropriate lodgement fee.

Upon the subsequent issue of a work visa to fill the position with the specified farm, the applicant then travels to New Zealand to take up their position.

## CIRCUMSTANCES

In order to maintain a flow of business and migrants coming to New Zealand, the defendant has fabricated the existence of several false farming businesses.

These are AJM Farming, Kinvarra Farms, Mathan Farms and Caldwell Farming (also known as Bridge Dairies) in Southland, and KG Farms in Northland.

### *Fencepost / Farmsource advertisement*

The defendant forged emails, which appear to be from Fonterra, to show that positions at these companies have been advertised locally and provided these 'emails' to applicants, who have subsequently included them in their applications to Immigration New Zealand.

### *WINZ Labour Market letters*

The defendant has also approached Work and Income New Zealand and claimed to be representing the companies, requesting they perform checks on the local labour market to ascertain whether there are any suitable applicants for positions at the companies locally.

The defendant has advised Work and Income that accommodation for employees on the farm will be shared and applicants need at least two years dairy experience, with a salary of \$38,000 per annum. These conditions, although acceptable to migrants travelling from the Philippines, make it very unlikely there will be any suitable local applicants and so Work and Income letters were produced confirming there was no local labour available to fill the positions. In one case (KG Farms) this detail was confirmed by email rather than by letter.

In all cases, as the company referred to does not exist, the confirmation provided by Work and Income New Zealand was obtained by deception. As a requirement without which a visa is unlikely to be issued, these documents have a high value to the defendant and she would be unable to claim her 76,000 pesos fee from applicants without them.

To avoid detection, the defendant altered the letters she obtained, removing reference to her own name, before supplying them to the applicants, who have included them in their applications.

### *Employment Agreements*

The defendant then manufactured Employment Agreements and, in some cases, job confirmation letters, which she supplied to the applicants to include with their visa applications as instructed.

### *Employer Supplementary Forms*

Finally, the defendant completed Immigration New Zealand 'Employer Supplementary Forms' for each position. These were all completed in a similar manner, typed with a scanned signature where the employer was to have signed it. This signature was the same scanned image as was used for the corresponding companies Employment agreements.

The Employer Supplementary Forms were then supplied to the applicants by the defendant, who included them as part of their visa applications, as instructed by the defendant.

### *Email correspondence and further documentation*

In some cases Immigration New Zealand Immigration Officers sought to verify the information that had been supplied. The principal method of communicating with employers utilised by Immigration Officers has been using the email addresses supplied on the Employer Supplementary Forms.

In these cases the defendant has communicated with the Immigration Officer under the guise of a fictitious employer, providing information as required or, in some instances, refusing to cooperate as requested.

On a number of occasions additional paperwork has been fabricated and supplied to Immigration New Zealand, such as confidential Fonterra Supplier Statements, as supplied to a legitimate farmer and provided to JAYME upon her request, before being altered and submitted in the name of a fictitious farm as evidence of its existence and sustainability.

Similarly, IRD and taxation forms have been created and supplied to Immigration New Zealand by the defendant in the name of fictitious companies.

In each case, where documents have been fabricated or altered and then supplied to applicants, who have subsequently supplied them to Immigration New Zealand, specific offences have been committed, either in terms of Forgery or Altering a Document and then using that document for pecuniary gain.

Where JAYME has supplied such documentation to an applicant knowing it will be supplied to Immigration New Zealand to support an application for a visa an offence of supplying false or misleading information has also been committed. The attached schedule of Charges describes how Charges relate to each document created and / or produced by JAYME.

Similarly, where information or documents have been supplied to an Immigration Officer by JAYME, an offence of Providing False or Misleading Information under the Immigration Act has been committed.

## **SCHEDULE OF CHARGES**

The offences identified in the attached schedule relate to seventeen Work Visa applications, each application relating to a position with one of the five fictitious dairy farming entities, AJM Farming, Caldwell Dairy Farm, Kinvarra Farms, Mathan Farms or KG Farms.

Each document may have several charges associated with its creation and subsequent usage.

A total of 310 Charges have been identified in relation to the documentation exhibited.

## **DEFENDANT COMMENTS**

The defendant has not been interviewed at this time.

The defendant is a 35 year old female who has not previously appeared before the Court.
