Million Trees is a programme for greening Auckland that will plant a million, predominantly native trees and shrubs across the region over three years.

The programme will green our city, offset carbon emissions, protect our water quality by planting along waterways and coastlines and improve our living environment.

Our Partners

Planting one million trees, shrubs and grasses will take an enormous effort from many people and organisations, and it would not be possible without the support of our key partners.

- **Department of Corrections** will deliver nursery space for growing trees and shrubs. Prisoners and offenders serving sentences of community work in the Auckland region will assist with site preparation, planting and maintenance.
- **Trees That Count** will count all the trees intended to be planted by the council in 2017. It will collaborate with the council to promote the need to plant native trees across the Auckland region and leverage technology and innovation to support the ongoing collection of monitoring data.

Ongoing work

There is already a lot of great planting work happening in Auckland via the council, local boards, iwi, schools, service and social sector groups, private entities, farmers, the council group, New Zealand Transport Agency and developers. Million Trees will work alongside all of these groups to facilitate the planting of a million trees in three years and accelerate projects where possible.


AUCKLAND GETS GREEN
