Overview

China is one of New Zealand's largest trading partner. Bilateral trade has since increased in recent years and is strengthened with the recent visit by President Xi Jingping. The upgrade NZ-China Free Trade Agreement identified priorities such as trade and custom cooperation deals, including export plans for chilled beef, goat an sheep meat into China and Chinese onions into New Zealand, an e-commerce arrangement to set high-leveled principals for more cooperation between nations.

China wants New Zealand to be part of the One-Belt-One-Road initiative set up by President Xi in 2013. Over US\$1.3 trillion worth of Roberts were already initiated and over 68 countries are involved. Using the concept of ancient Silk Road, the initiative looks at infrastructural partnerships and investments between countries.


