

8068 (2006). **Anne Tolley** to the **Associate Minister for Social Development and Employment** (28 Jun 2006): How many young people under the care of Child, Youth and Family have been held in police cells by month for 2006?

**Hon Ruth Dyson (Associate Minister for Social Development and Employment)** replied: Child, Youth and Family is made aware of young people detained in police custody for longer than 24 hours. Some of these young people may have been, or may subsequently be, placed in the care of the department; others may not. The attached table shows the number of young people detained in police custody for periods longer than 24 hours, by month for 2006.

13302 (2006). **Anne Tolley** to the **Associate Minister for Social Development and Employment** (25 Sep 2006): What is the optimal occupancy rate of each Child, Youth and Family Services residential facility; what was the occupancy as at June 30 2005 and 2006?

**Hon Ruth Dyson (Associate Minister for Social Development and Employment)** replied: The attached table shows the optimal and actual occupancy for each Youth Justice facility as at the end of June 2005 and 2006. As Care and Protection residences have a small number of beds and the resident population is fairly stable, Child, Youth and Family reports on occupancy rates as a percentage of availability each month. The attached table shows the calculations for each Care and Protection residence for the months of June 2005 and June 2006.
