

boats for ½ an hour. In future everyone must wear his overcoat after 5 o'clock on deck, owing to several cases of neumonia on board.

Friday 16th. Spotty's birthday 25. Full marching order 7 pm. Went ashore in boats. Went for route march of about 7 or 8 miles, pleased to get on decent marching soil once again, quite enjoyed march. Arrived back on board 2 30 pm. Free for rest of day.

Saturday 17th. Physical drill 6 15 am. Washing clothes from 9 am till 10 am. Airing blankets from 10 am till 12 am. Free for rest of day.

Sunday 18th. Physical drill 6 15 am. Rifle exercise 9 am. Paid in evening 5/- each man. Tuk improcurable.

Monday 19th. Went ashore 7 30 am in boats, went for a route march with Wellington 15 platoon as we had lost our own company, arrived back on board 1 30 pm. Concert by Australians in evening.

Tuesday 20th. Physical drill 6 45 am. Full marching order and blankets 10 am. Kit inspection by Sandy, afterwards rifle exercises and fire control practice. 12 pm oiling boats, afterwards boat fleet inspection by Sandy. Short talk by Sandy on health matters.

Wednesday 21st. Physical drill 6 45 am. Lecture by Major B in morning. Lecture by Sandy in afternoon. Arrival of mail, 8 for me, a treat to get some news as we had had none for over a month.

Thursday 22nd. Physical drill 6 45 am. Took Spotty's place as mess orderly, as he went for row in the boat, missed all parades all day. Rifle inspection by Sgt. Major Glanville. More mail arrived 2 more for me and parcle, pleased to get pipes and mouth organ.

Friday 23rd. Physical drill 6 45 am. 9 30 am rifle exercise and Semaphore signalling. 2 pm inspection of water bottles and afterwards rifle exercise. Numerous transports pulling out of the bay.

Saturday 24th. Physical drill 6 45 am. Disc, mess tin and field dressing parade 9 am. Full marching (heavy) order parade in afternoon including blankets etc. etc. Pulled out of Bay about a mile in readiness to move off tomorrow.

Sunday 25th. Left Lemnos 8 am beautiful day, can hear bombardment of Dardanells forty miles off. Dinner 11 am in readiness for disembarkment. Landed on Gallapolli Painsular 7 pm, under heavy fire. Australians captured 4 guns and some prisoners. Colonel Stuart killed. Entrenched ourselves about 8 pm worked till dawn following day.

Monday 26th. Rained a little, on the lookout from dawn, many snipers about. Sgt. Guy and 6 of us were sent out to look for snipers and to take observations, was fired upon by snipers, narrow escapes, found many dead Australians amongst scrub, awful sight, getting used to it now. Left trenches in afternoon relieved by A and B Coy. Went up
