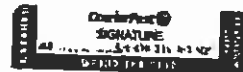

Your resident visa and travel conditions

We have granted you a resident visa with travel conditions. Your visa allows you to live, work, and study in New Zealand. It will not expire while you remain inside New Zealand.

4. Kim DOTCOM learnt from the first individual that a named UK individual associated with the entertainment industry was planning to travel to New Zealand and would be welcome to stay with Kim Dotcom.
