



MĀORI TELEVISION Tāmaki Makaurau Poll October 2020

POLL DATES:	Tuesday 6 to Wednesday 7 October 2020. The median response was collected on Wednesday 7 October 2020.
TARGET POPULATION:	Eligible voters in the Tāmaki Makaurau electorate.
SAMPLE POPULATION:	Eligible Tāmaki Makaurau voters who are contactable on a landline or mobile phone.
SAMPLE SIZE:	500 respondents agreed to participate.
WEIGHTING	The results are weighted to reflect the Tāmaki Makaurau voting population in terms of gender and age.
SAMPLE ERROR:	Based on this sample of 500 respondents, the maximum sampling error (for a result of 50%) is +/- 4.4%, at the 95% confidence level.
CODE COMPLIANCE:	This poll was conducted in accordance with the Research Association New Zealand Code of Practice and the International Chamber of Commerce/European Society for Opinion and Market Research Code on Market and Social Research.





PARTY

57% of respondents say they intend to party vote Labour, 9% for the Māori Party, 3% National, 7% Greens, 5% NZ First and 1% ACT. 11% were undecided and 5% refused to say.
