# **SEEK NZ** Employment Report



## **OVERVIEW OF JUNE 2021:**

#### STATE OF THE NATION:

- Seek.co.nz has its highest number of jobs ever advertised for the fourth consecutive month.
- Applications per job ad fell 9% month-on-month (m/m).
- SEEK job ads were up by 1% m/m.
- SEEK job ads were up by 115% in June 2021 when compared to June 2020 (y/y) and were up 24% when compared to June 2019.
- Industries contributing most to the m/m job ad growth were Administration & Office Support, Manufacturing, Transport & Logistics and Retail & Consumer Products.

## STATE OF THE REGIONS:

- Job ad growth increased in Auckland and Canterbury, whilst Wellington dropped 1% m/m.
- Waikato led m/m growth adding 11% more jobs.

### STATE OF THE NATION: JOB AD BOOM AT PEAK, APPLICATIONS PER JOB AD DECREASING

The latest SEEK Employment Report shows job ad growth sits at a record high, while candidate availability is near record low levels.

Rob Clark, Country Manager, SEEK NZ comments: "For the fourth consecutive month, job ad growth figures in New Zealand have reached a record high. Job ads were up 1% from May 2021 to June 2021. and the market for job seekers remains strong. Compared to pre-pandemic numbers, job ads grew by 24% compared to June 2019."


"In the last few months, we have had up to 5.2 million visits to seek.co.nz each month, which is a positive sign. However, since the pandemic began, the number of candidates who view a job ad on seek.co.nz and then go on to apply for a role has fallen by 15%. We understand that candidates are being more selective and are approaching new roles with caution. In fact, our research shows that 32% of Kiwis remain worried about their job security, and 14% have held back from changing jobs because of COVID-19.

"This fall in jobs applications is not limited to one industry or a specific region. There are staffing challenges in nearly every sector, with month-on-month applications per job ad down in 18 of the 28 industries SEEK monitors."

### STATE OF THE INDUSTRIES: RETAIL ON THE RISE ONCE AGAIN

The industries contributing the greatest volume increase to job ad growth m/m were Administration & Office Support (up 12% m/m), Retail & Consumer Products (up 10% m/m) and Manufacturing, Transport & Logistics (up 8% m/m).


Rob Clark continues: "Retail & Consumer Products has made a strong contribution to job ad growth in June. Despite the year we've had, and the shift to online shopping, Kiwis are still keen on the in-store experience. In particular, month-onmonth job ads grew for merchandisers by 15%, store management increased by 14% and retail assistants were up 5%. All important roles to help visually attract shoppers and to deliver a great customer experience.

"Administration & Office Support job ads rose by over 12% this month. Roles in record management and document control were up 29% and contract administration up 29% – a sign offices are getting back to normal and needing essential support and administrative staff."

Some roles in Manufacturing, Transport & Logistics, Administration & Office Support and Retail & Consumer Products include:

- Retail & Consumer Products with roles for area/multi-site managers; department/assistant managers; store managers; merchandisers; retail assistants; and buying.
- Administration & Office Support with roles for administrative assistants; client & sales administration; office management; PA, EA & secretarial; and receptionists.
- Manufacturing, Transport & Logistics with roles for warehousing, storage & distribution; road transport; purchasing, procurement & inventory; product, planning & scheduling; machine operators; couriers, drivers & postal services; assembly & process work; and management.
